## UCLA Study Finds Latinos Remain Underrepresented in the Smithsonian Institution

In partnership with the UCLA Latino Politics and Policy Initiative, the UCLA Chicano Studies Research Center conducted the first analysis of the Smithsonian's progress in addressing the recommendations of the landmark 1994 report *Willful Neglect: The Smithsonian Institution and U.S. Latinos.*
