The film is part of the Coalition for Humane Immigrant Rights' (CHIRLA) "Know Your Rights" video series. A Q&A with director Anike Tourse will follow the screening, moderated by Chris Zepeda-Millán, associate professor of public policy and Chicana/o studies at UCLA.
