Maricón Collective was formed in the spring of 2014 as a queer Chicano/Latino DJ and artist collective "with the hope to bring Queer POC people together through dance and celebration" (mission statement). Re-appropriating the once negative connotation of the term Maricón, they have participated in creating visibility for a new generation of queer Chican@/Latin@s in the Los Angeles area. In addition to developing a cult following via social media and hosting various fundraising community events, they have also collaborated with Chicana/o artists such as Alice Bag, Joey Terrill, and Shizu Saldamando.
