

Amid today's multipronged attacks on immigrant communities and growing threats to democratic participation, the children of immigrants and refugees often encounter significant barriers to exercising their voice in the public arena. Despite these challenges, some of these young people engage in nonpartisan grassroots campaigns, addressing issues such as education, health, environmental justice, immigrant rights, housing, and voting rights.
