The destruction of Rivera's mural for the RCA Building at Rockefeller Center in New York is one of the best known examples of censorship in the United States. Although scholars have focused on Rivera's painted image of Lenin, this talk examines the controversy over his mural within the context of artistic/architectural collaboration and the diverging views of public art in the 1930s.

Anna Indych-López specializes in the modern art of Latin America, specifically Mexico. She is the author of *Muralism without Walls: Rivera, Orozco and Siqueiros in the United States,* 1927-1940 (University of Pittsburgh, 2009) and co-author of *Diego Rivera: Murals for The Museum of Modern Art* (MoMA, 2011). She is currently writing a book on muralist Judy Baca for the CSRC *A Ver* series.
