This documentary by award-winning director Dante Alencastre focuses on the life of renowned Los Angeles–based trans-Latina activist and leader Bamby Salcedo and shows how her work gives voice and visibility to not only the transgender community but also to the multiple overlapping communities her life has touched (Latina, immigrant, HIV+, youth, and LGBT, among others). The film premiered at L.A.'s Outfest in 2013 and is the first feature-length film to document the life of a trans Latina. The screening will be followed by a Q&A with Bamby Salcedo and the director. Alicia Gaspar de Alba, professor of English and Chicana/o and women's studies and chair of the UCLA LGBT studies program, is the faculty curator of this event.
