The UCLA Chicano Studies Research Center is pleased to host an exhibition reception for *You Found Me: Photographs by Christopher Anthony Velasco*. As the artist describes, "*You Found Me* is an ongoing photographic exploration of the effects of generalized anxiety disorder (GAD). Using photographs of randomly found shopping carts, I describe feelings of depression, displacement, and abandonment that are triggered by the condition. As the title expresses, I am, for the first time, being open and honest about my longtime struggle with GAD. I am allowing you to see me."

Christopher Anthony Velasco is a mixed-media artist working in Los Angeles. His photography and collage pieces explore the urban landscape, public and private space, and questions of identity.

The exhibition is on view January 3 – March 21, 2014, in the CSRC library and vitrine during regular library hours (Mon.-Fri., 10 a.m.-5 p.m.). The exhibition and reception are FREE.
