

His first book of poems, *Cultural Studies*, was published by Carnegie Mellon University Press in 2009 and was a finalist for the 2010 Paterson Poetry Prize. His fiction has been awarded the Narrative Prize, the Michener-Copernicus Award, the Playboy Fiction Prize, and fellowships from the Iowa Writers' Workshop and the Wisconsin Institute for Creative Writing. His stories have appeared in *Best American Nonrequired Reading, Best New American Voices*, and *Keeping the Wolves at Bay: Stories by Emerging American Writers*. He serves as editor of *jubilat*.
