



LATINA FUTURES, 2050 LAB: ADVANCING LATINA REPRESENTATION & LEADERSHIP

Latinas are one of the fastest growing demographics in the United States, yet Latina voices are still disproportionately underrepresented and often overlooked in government and public policy decisions. **The Latina Futures, 2050 Lab**, founded by Veronica Terriquez, who directs UCLA's Chicano Studies Research Center, and Sonja Diaz, founding director of the UCLA Latino Policy & Politics Institute, have joined together to provide much-needed insights on the experiences of Latinas across the country and the policies that affect them most through research and data. This ambitious project was funded through a \$15 million California state budget investment and is an important step forward in investing and integrating Latinas in public policy.
