BERLIN

Pawel Althamer's "Almech" at Deutsche Guggenheim, Unted den Linden 13/15, Berlin, Opening October 28 through January 16

Relocating a branch of his father's plastics factory from Warsaw to Berlin, Althamer creates a museum exchange program with participatory projects in both locations. The project seeks to give a face to the host institution, byt producing sculptural reproductions in the likeness of museum staff, visitors, and curators. deutsche-guggenheim.de

Beatriz Milhazes at Galerie Max Hetzler, Oudenarder Straße 16-20, Berlin, through November 5

Presenting four large scale paintings, a mobile and recent collages, the Brazilian native uses a unique process of decal transfer with the printed materials of candy and chocolate wrappers to make brightly colored and stylized works reminiscent of the tropical climate and vegetation of the Latin American country. LOS ANGELES

"Mapping Another L.A.: The Chicano Art Movement" at The Fowler Museum at UCLA, 405 Hilgard Ave., Los Angeles, through February 26

Pacific Standard Time blazes on with this exhibition focused on the artistic movement that altered the space and landscape of the City of Angels physically with public works like the murals of Johnny D. Gonzalez, the monumental exhibitions of Los Four at LACMA, and the performances and institutional interventions of Asco. fowler.ucla.edu

TOKYO

"Goya: Lights and Shadows. Masterpieces of the Museo del Prado" at The National Museum of Western Art, 7-7 Ueno-koen, Taito-ku, Tokyo, through January 29

Over 72 oil paintings and drawings from the Museo del Prado in Madrid, in addition to 51 prints from the collection of the NMWA and other Japanese institutions can be seen by the Spanish Old Master. Focusing on Goya's themes of lights and shadows, his pictorial arts can be glimsed in a different light all together at this traveling exhibition. nmwa.qo.jp

The legendary New York photographer with a knack for photographing the strange, is on view in her first major retrospective in France where viewers can explore the origins of her photographic sensibility. This group show boasts an impressive list of participants including Wallace Berman, Carl Andre, Alighiero e Boetti, Alfredo Jaar, Glenn Ligon, Raymond Pettibon, Catherine Opie and more. BOSTON

Trisha Brown Dance Company's "Floor of the Forest" at ICA/Boston, 100 Northern Ave., Boston, through January 15

In conjunction with the Dance/Draw program, Trisha Brown's choreographed sculpture, "Floor of the Forest," comes to life with a pair of dancers who navigate an intricately installed 12 x 14 foot steel pipe frame, laden with ropes and threaded with used clothing. No two performances will be the same, as each is subject to the chance of the individual dancers's decisions and movements. icaboston.org
