New Star Found Orbiting Black Hole

The discovery by UCLA researchers and colleagues of a new star orbiting the Milky Way's black hole at a faster rate than any other star was reported Wednesday by Ars Technica and Saturday by the Los Angeles Times. Andrea Ghez, a UCLA professor of physics and astronomy who holds the Lauren B. Leichtman and Arthur E. Levine Chair in Astrophysics, was quoted in the coverage.
